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What is this product?

Type

This is an investment fund.

Investment objective

The fund aims to provide capital growth over a 3-5 year investment cycle by investing in commodity related instruments worldwide.

Investment policy

The fund will invest in the energy, agriculture and metals sectors worldwide. Investments can be made indirectly through derivatives and exchange traded funds and/or directly in equities and commodity related transferable securities. The fund may use derivatives to reduce its exposure to various investment risks

(hedging). The fund may use commodity related derivatives to take long and short positions. The fund may use leverage up to 50% of its net assets. The fund will not acquire any physical commodities directly. The fund may hold up to 100% of its assets in cash or cash equivalent liquidity.

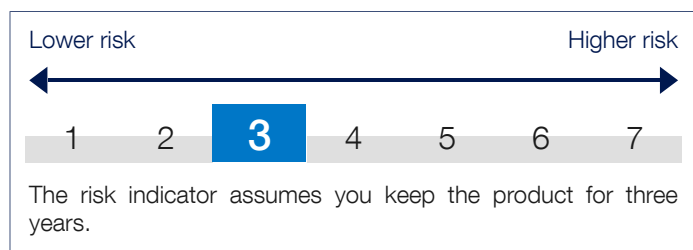
The fund is valued with reference to the net asset value of the underlying assets.

Intended retail investor

The fund is intended for institutional investors but may be available to sophisticated retail investors.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risks



You may not be able to sell your product easily or you may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class.

The product is in this category because it seeks to provide rewards whilst limiting price volatility.

If the fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment. You are not covered by the Luxembourg compensation scheme.

What are the costs?

Costs over time

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest EUR 10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?
